RARE HORNBILL SIGHTED AT NML CAMPUS

The lush and serene campus of the National Medical Library (NML) serves as a captivating oasis not just for information seekers but also for various species of birds that have chosen it as their permanent habitat. In the month of May, a delightful and rare sighting occurred when the officials of NML spotted an Indian grey hornbill (Ocyceros birostris) within the premises. The Indian grey hornbill is a commonly found hornbill species across the Indian subcontinent. Often seen in pairs, this arboreal bird is adorned with beautiful grey feathers covering its body, while its belly exhibits a light grey or dull white hue. The horn itself is black or dark grey, accentuated by a casque that extends to the curvature point of the horn. The Indian grey hornbill is characterized by its distinctive appearance. It has grey feathers covering most of its body, with a contrasting light grey or dull white belly. One of the most prominent features is its large horn-like bill, which is black or dark grey in colour and is complemented by a casque on top. The casque extends up to the curvature point of the bill, adding to its unique and striking appearance.

These hornbills are known for their melodious calls and can be heard chirping throughout the day. They are omnivorous and feed on a variety of foods, including fruits, insects, small vertebrates, and occasionally even small birds. Remarkably, the Indian grey hornbill has managed to adapt to urban environments, making appearances in many cities where they cleverly utilize large trees in avenues to thrive. It is a testament to their resilience and ability to coexist with human activities.

Capturing this exceptional moment, Mr. Shuaib Ahmad, ALIO, took photographs of the hornbill, preserving the enchanting sight for posterity. 
PROMOTIONS
