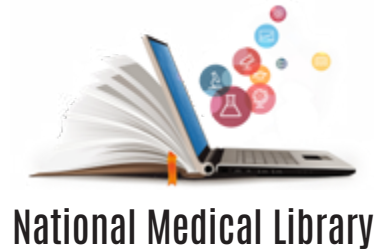

# NATIONAL MEDICAL LIBRARY

## DIRECTORATE GENERAL OF HEALTH SERVICES

### Introduction

National Medical Library of India is the Apex body of Directorate General of Health Services (Dte.GHS), Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India. One of its greatest strengths is being the richest collection of Medical books, journals, reports and electronic database. NML was established on 7th April, 1966 on the recommendation of Bohre's Committee on Health Survey and Development headed by Sir Joseph Bohre in 1946. It occupies an important position in country's health care information delivery system. It has a huge collection of more than 7 lakhs of books, bound volume of journals, reports etc.

### History

The library was initially conceived as departmental library having a small collection of books for the use of officers of the erstwhile Directorate General of Indian Medical Services (DGIMS). The DGIMS was later merged with the Office of the Public Health Commissioner in India in 1947 to form the Directorate General of Health Services (Dte.GHS) and the library became DGHS Library. Realizing the need for a Central Library to support academic, research and clinical work of Biomedical Professionals in the country, the DGHS library was developed gradually and declared as Central Medical Library in 1961 and as the National Medical Library on 7th April 1966.

### Mission

The National Medical Library aims to provide wide and efficient, library and information services to the health science professionals (HSPs) across the country and trained the Library professionals working in the Health Institutions. It functions under the administrative control of the Directorate General of Health Services, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India.

### Aims and Objectives

- Procure a copy of each costly and infrequently used reading material which is uneconomical for each Medical College Library/Institute to procure;
- Build an Exhaustive Collection of Medical and Biomedical Books, Journals, Reports, Databases, etc.;
- Form a Repository Medical Library for the country;
- Provide Expert consultation services to other medical libraries/institutions in the country;
- To train the Health Science Library professionals across the country;
- Maintain the National level Consortium of the online health science resources on the theme of one nation one subscription.

### Library Timings

#### Weekdays

8.00 AM to 8.00 PM

#### Saturday, Sunday and Holidays

9.30 AM to 6.00 PM



Stacks are closed 30 minutes before the closing of the library

### Library Rules

**Entry:** The library is mainly a Reference Library in the field of Medical and Allied Sciences. It is open for consultation to the entire Medical, Para medical and Allied Professions.

**For Membership:** Members of the following Institutions can become borrowing members of the Library:

1. Staff of Medical/Dental/Nursing/AYUSH Colleges/ Institutions in Delhi;
2. Staff of Government Hospitals in Delhi;

3. Directors of Health and Medical Services of the State Government;
4. Members of the Medical and Allied Professionals engaged in Private Practice or working in Private Hospitals/Clinics in Delhi/NCR.

For Non-Members/Visitors are required to obtain entry card issued on application in the prescribed form, from the Reference counter of the Library. They will also have to record their name, address and time of arrival and put their signature in the Register kept with the Janitor.

## Services

### Borrowing Facilities

**Membership:** Members of the following institutions can become borrowing members of the Library:

1. Staff of Medical/Dental/Nursing/AYUSH Colleges/ Institutions in Delhi;
2. Staff of Government Hospitals of Delhi;
3. Directors of Health and Medical Services of the State Government;
4. Officers/officials of Dte.GHS and MoH&FW, Government of India;
5. Registered (any Health Science Council) Medical and Allied Professionals engaged in Private Practice or working in Private Hospitals/Clinics in Delhi and NCR region.

### Member/NOC

- Institutional Membership: Application forms for membership may be obtained from Library or downloaded from the official website of the NML. It must be forwarded through the administrative head of the institution, office of the applicant. They will also obtain “NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE” from the library. Change of address should also be communicated to the library. The membership is valid for 02 (Two) years from the date of issue and same may be renewed time to time. They can borrow 01 (One) book at a time for a period of 15 days.
- Private Membership: The health professionals who are working in private Hospitals/Clinics, etc. may submit their application along with refundable security of Rs. 7000/- through Demand Draft. The security deposit is refundable by surrendering the

Membership Card and obtaining a “NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE” from the Library. The membership is valid for 02 (Two) years from the date of issue and same may be renewed from time to time. He/she can borrow 01 (One) book at a time for a period of 15 days.

- Members are required to sign in the Membership register. It is, therefore, necessary to collect the Membership Card personally between 10.00 am to 5.00 PM on weekdays (Monday to Friday). No registration of Membership will be done on Holidays.
- “No Demand Certificate” will be issued after surrendering the Membership Card, between 10.00 AM to 5.00 PM on weekdays (Monday to Friday). NOC will not be issued on Saturday/Holidays. Forwarding authorities must ensure that only enrolled Institutional members of NML should obtain “No-Demand Certificate” from library.
- The borrower’s card is “Non-transferable”. But if anyone wants to draw a book against other member’s ticket, he/she should bring an “Authority Letter” from the owner of the ticket specifying the book to be borrowed. Permanent authorization is not permissible.
- Members will be responsible for the loss of their membership card. Loss of membership card must be notified immediately. If any book is drawn against card, the owner of the card will be held responsible.
- The library staff has the right to ask the users to show their Membership/Identity card otherwise may not be allowed for consulting the library.
- Inter Library Loan: Biomedical scientific and Technical Libraries/Documentation Centres located in Delhi/NCR can borrow publications on reciprocal basis. Journals will not be issued as photocopies can be obtained on payment basis.
- The National Medical Library (NML) has reserve the right to recall the issued book/s from the members at any time if it is urgently required by other users of the library. Staffs of the NML have to abide the rules and regulations and not to issue any book/document to the non-member of the library.
- Damaged/Lost of Book: Books damaged or lost will have to be replaced with the latest edition, failing which the original cost of the damaged or lost books

+ 25% penalty, have to be paid by the borrower. If any book is in a damaged condition while taking out from the library, this should be brought to the notice of the librarian; otherwise the borrower will be held responsible for the same.

- Dog-earring, marking or underlining the pages of publications or cutting pages, illustrations, advertisements or damaging the publications in any way is strictly prohibited. The defaulters will not only be required to pay the cost and penalty for such offences but will be deprived of the library facility and the appropriate authority will be asked to take suitable action against him/her.
- Smoking/playing cards in the Library/library campus is strictly prohibited. No eatables are allowed to be carried in the Reading Rooms and stacks.

## Services

### NML-ERMED Consortium

National Medical Library's Electronic Resources in Medicine (ERMED) Consortium is an initiative taken by Directorate General of Health Services and Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India to provide nationwide electronic information resources in the field of medicine for delivering effective health care. It was started in the year 2008 with 39 member institutes [28-ICMR + 10 DGHS + AIIMS-Delhi] and presently it is having 75 member institutes including NML. The aims of this consortium are as follows:

- Round the clock instant online access to multiple users through IP Address and customer ID;
- Access to resources beyond the physical space and time of the library. Users can access libraries e-Journal resources from their department;
- Benefit of cross sharing;
- Ultimate aim of any e-Journal consortium is to make online journal literature available to unreachable medical scholars working in the country through electronic media;
- Facilitate better management of information resources in electronic environment;

- Hassles of archiving print resources and their management is reduced;
- Dissemination of e-Journal literature is faster, more economical and more efficient.

Presently, 75 state and centrally funded Government Institutions including NML with 08 AIIMS is the member of the consortium. There is no membership fee charged from member institutes and the MoH&FW has provided funds required for the purchase of electronic journals under the NML-ERMED Consortium.

The consortium is coordinated through its headquarter set up at the NML. 221+ high quality online e-journals are presently subscribed from the 05 following leading publishers:

- British Medical Journal Publishing Group
- Cambridge University Press
- Wolters Kluwers - Lippincott Williams & Wilkins
- Oxford University Press
- Wiley

### Access Medicine Database

National Medical Library is continuously striving to expand its e-resources and trying to provide information services to the members sitting at faraway places or at their homes. The NML has recently subscribed the most relevant database i.e. Access Medicine Database of McGraw Hill. The access of this database has been extended to all NML members of the library and 64 member institutes under NML ERMED Consortium from March 2023. The Access Medicine Database supports medical education and clinical practice with the following collections:

1. 160+ Book Title
2. 2000+ Clinical Cases
3. 37900+ Self-assessment Questions
4. 2900+ Videos, Audio and Multimedia Resources
5. 600+ Infographic
6. 7000+ Patient Education Guides
7. 257000+ High-Resolution Images
8. 130+ Audio podcasts

### Remote Access Facility through - MyLOFT Software

The National Medical Library has recently subscribed the MyLOFT (My Library On Fingertips) software for

providing remote access facility of the e-resources of NML to its members in Delhi & National Capital Region. In fact MyLOFT is an app for accessing, organizing and sharing digital content and e-resources subscribed by any library. It has been developed by EIFL (Electronic Information for Libraries) which is a not-for-profit organization that works with libraries to enable access to knowledge in developing and transition economy countries in Africa, Asia Pacific, Europe and Latin America. It allows users to download content and save for offline reading.

Key features of this app are:

1. Save content and access it offline
2. Access library subscribed e-resources
3. Read/follow RSS feeds
4. Tag and organize content
5. Highlight & play your content
6. The auto-play and listen features
7. Accessible via laptop/mobile phone

### **Document Delivery/Online article request Services**

As the mode of the library services are changed, NML has replaced the reprography service by online article request services. Scanned copy of available literature is provided through e-mail. Single copies of each reference only are provided for personal use of the applicant. Multiple copies will not be provided.

Borrowing of books is allowed to registered members only. All doctors and faculty working in government hospitals and medical colleges in Delhi/NCR can become borrowing members. Private practitioners who are residents of Delhi/NCR can also become borrowing member by depositing a refundable security deposit of Rs. 5,000/- (Rs. Five thousand only). One book is issued at a time for maximum period of 14 days.

### **Access of Library**

NML provides access to all Health Science Professionals (HSPs) for reference and consultation. It is one of the biggest medical library in the country, users including PG students, teachers, research scholars, practicing doctors/ surgeons, health administrators, drug manufactures, nurses etc., comes across the country. Library also receives a number of reference queries and provides quick reference services through email/telephone.

### **OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue)**

The National Medical Library is using e-Granthalaya software for the library automation. This software has been developed and managed by National Informatics Centre, New Delhi. Most of the data of the NML has been fed into it and accessible round the clock to the information seekers. The library is also providing OPAC facility in its premises.

### **Training, Webinars, Conferences and user awareness programmes**

NML regularly organise series of webinars, region wise training-cum-awareness programmes and conferences for the benefit of end users for the optimum utilization of e-resources subscribed under the ERMED Consortium and Access Medicine Database.

Future plans for Innovative services of NML

- To develop a 'National Database of Health Science Theses and Dissertations';
- To coordinate with the respective Health science councils (Medical/Nursing/Dental, etc.) to mandate all health science Medical Colleges/Institutes/ Professionals to deposit a copy of each publication (Book/Journal/Theses/Dissertations/Report, etc.) to the NML;
- To organise Short-Term Training Courses/Apprenticeship in order to train the Health Science Library Professional across the country;
- To compile/develop an online "National Union Catalogues of Health Science Serials"
- To maintain a Special Reading Hall, which may be opened 24 x 7 without disturbing regular services of NML.

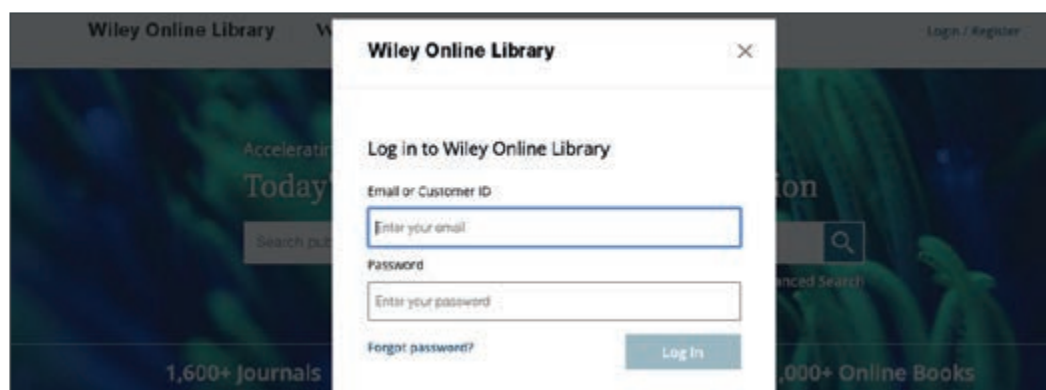
## HOMEPAGE

Anyone can browse, search and view abstracts on Wiley Online Library without logging in. But once you are a registered user, you will be able to save titles and searches and set up email content alerts from the My Account area.

- The Login and Register tabs are up in the top right of the homepage, and will stay there, no matter where you navigate on the site.



- When you click Login/Register, you will have the option to login as an individual or through your organization (if this access method is set up) using your email address and password. When in doubt, ask your librarian.
- If you don't have an account, you can sign up by choosing the 'new user' option in the bottom of the menu.
- Good news for library administrators! You no longer have to visit a separate login page for administrative access. You can login from the homepage using your Customer ID and password.

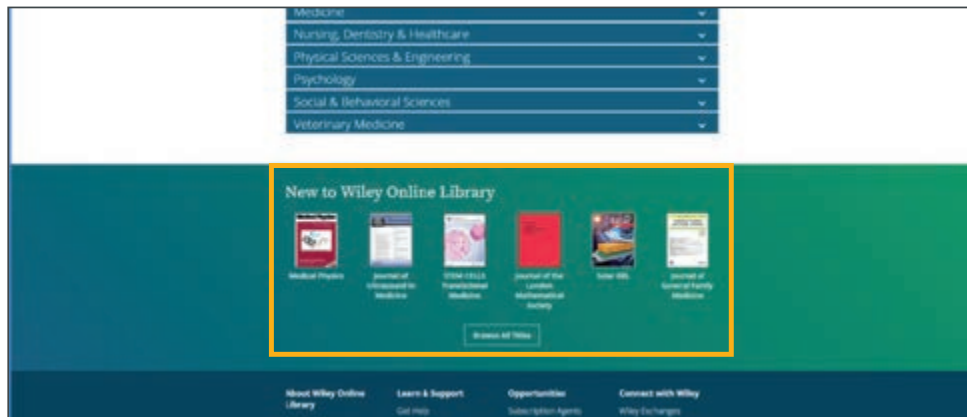

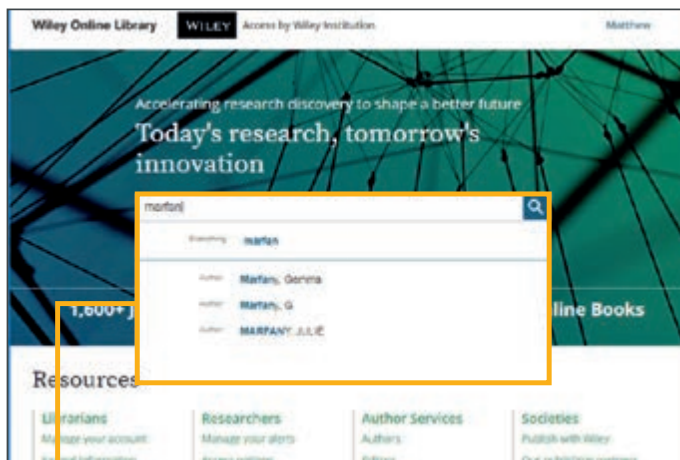
Scrolling down the homepage, you will see the different subjects, with major subheadings. These pages will direct you to content related to the subjects.

We know that the number one thing users want to do on Wiley Online Library is search. That's why the search bar is front and center on the top of the homepage.



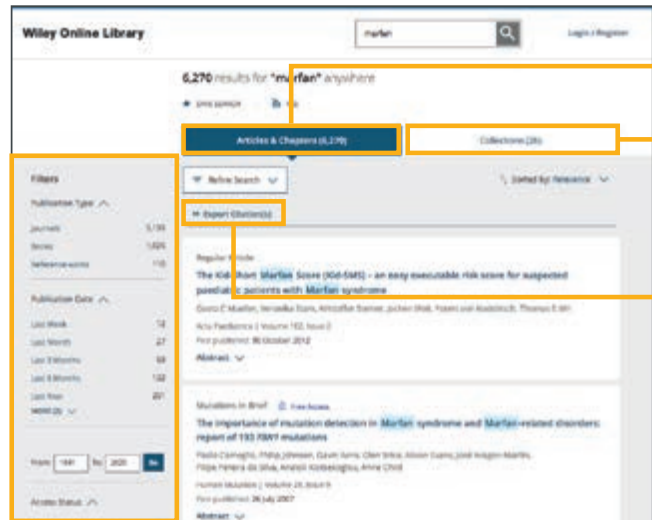
## SIMPLE SEARCH BAR

## ADDITIONAL SEARCH FEATURES



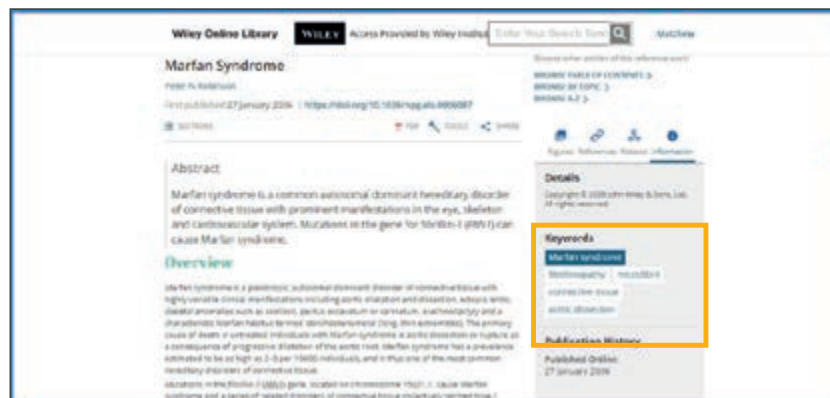
“Articles and Chapters” shows a list of online book chapters and articles that match your search criteria.

Several societies use Virtual Issues and Journal Special issues to group articles on a specific topic. Collections allow users to view results for Virtual and Special issues that match their search.

You have the ability to export citations individually or in bulk.

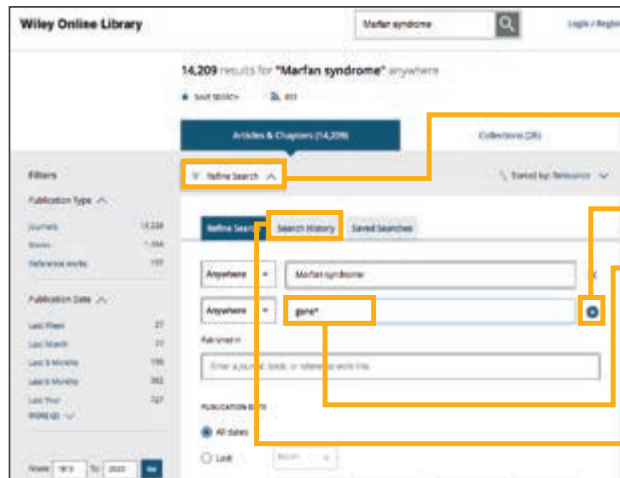
Once your search results are fully populated, you have many more options to filter your search in the left hand column. Whether you want to filter by content type, publication year, topic, publication title, author name, or open access, we have the filter for you.

## KEYWORDS



Once you have clicked into an article, keywords will appear in the information pane to the right-hand side, allowing you to further your search using subject vocabulary related to the original search term. If you were to click on the key word “Marfan’s syndrome,” in those keywords, you would be taken to search results specifically about that topic.

## REFINE SEARCH

1. After you've searched a keyword, you can refine your search to add more terms and perform a more accurate "Boolean search."
2. You can add multiple keywords by selecting the 'plus' button highlighted here.
3. You can add an asterisk (\*) to a keyword to search for the word in multiple forms (for example, searching for gene\* will bring up word results for gene, but also for genetics, and so on).
4. If you want to look back at how you got to this point in your search, you can see everything through the "Search History" tab.

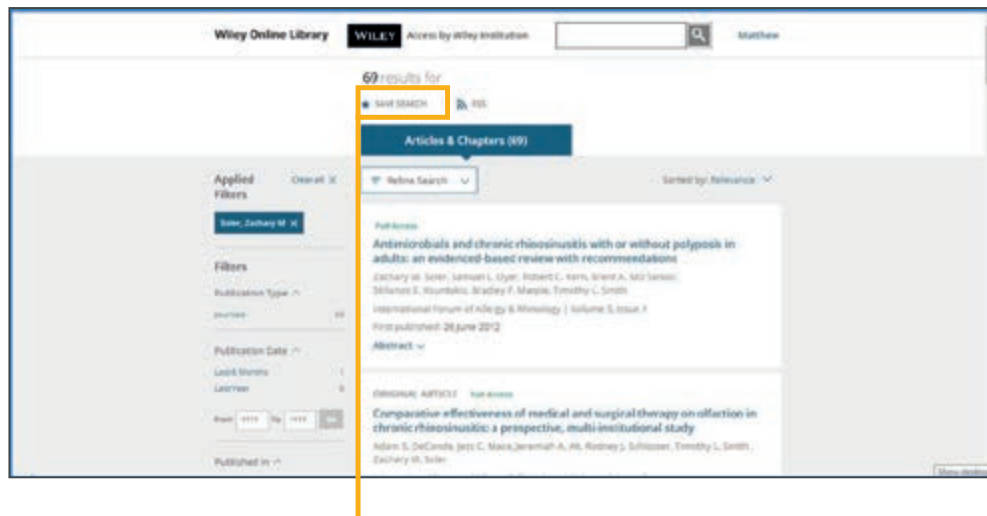
## ADVANCED SEARCH

1. Back at the homepage, you can click on the "Advanced Search" tab right underneath the search bar.
2. You can combine search terms without having to construct your own Boolean logic. Check out the search tips on the right side of the page to help. Much like the Refine Search function we saw earlier, you can now provide a few filters on their initial search. In this scenario, let's imagine you want to find more information about cryptocurrency.
3. You can start with the term 'cryptocurrency' and add the terms, "bitcoin". You can also limit the search to a specific journal. If you want to focus on accounting journals, type the first few letters of the word ("acc") and all the journals with that in their name will appear below.

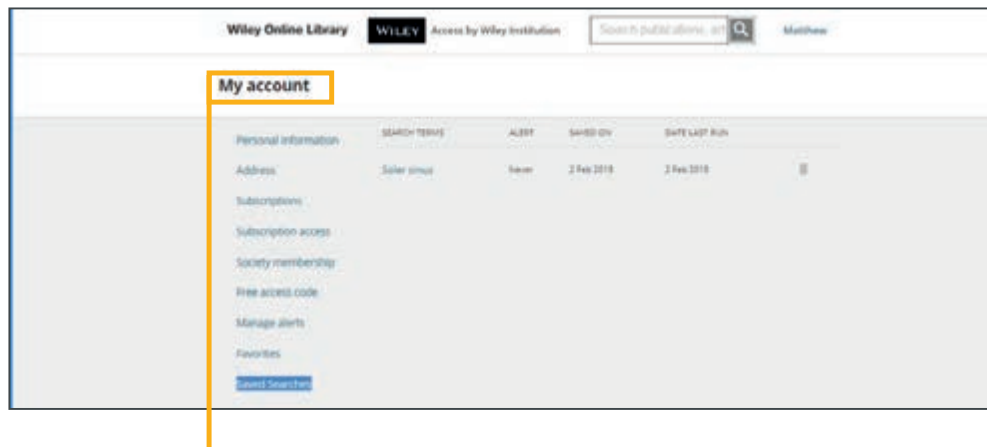

## SAVING SEARCHES



1. To save a search and view your saved searches, you must log in to your account. After performing a search, you can save it by clicking 'save search' at the top of the page. This will link to your WOL account. Once the search is named, a pop up will appear and you can choose to receive updates as new articles filter in on a daily, weekly, or monthly basis. Or you can choose to not to be notified at all.



2. To revisit a search, you can go into your personal account and look at Saved Searches. Like saving your search with updates, you can also enable an RSS feed.

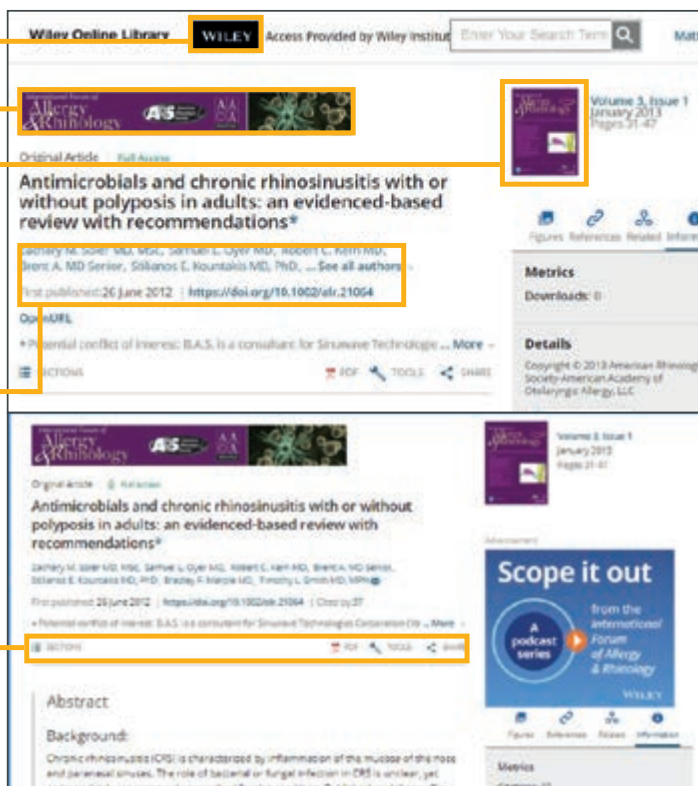

## JOURNAL CONTENT FEATURES

Once you've clicked on a link for a journal article, you will be taken to the article abstract.

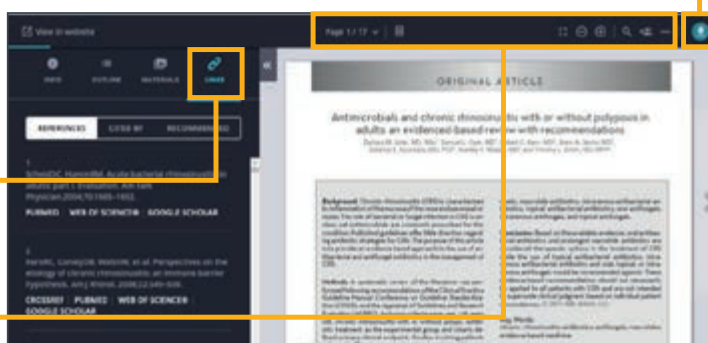
1. If your institution or organization provides the access for this content, there will be a link at the top of the page with their logo.
2. Each article page displays its respective journal banner.
3. On the far right of the article page is a link to the journal's homepage.
4. Below the journal banner, you'll see bibliographic content about the article, including authors and publication date.

Whether you have full access to the article or not, you will always have full access to the abstract. You will then be given the option to read the article in HTML. By clicking the "Sections" button you can jump to a particular area of the article.



## PDF, Tools and Sharing

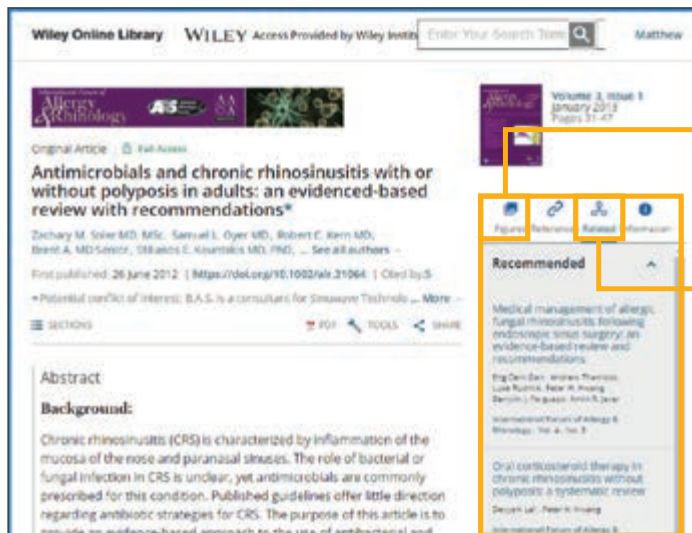
1. Download the PDF to view the content as an interactive ePDF.
2. The 'Links' tab will give you a listing of all the works the article has cited, with outbound linking to each article. You can also view related texts and references.
3. Zoom in and out on the page, resize, print, share, and much more.

1. To the right of the PDF option on the article page, there's a drop-down **Tools menu**. From here, you have the option to request permission to use the article in various ways, export citations, or add it to your favorites (you have to be signed in for this one).
2. **Share** the article through various channels, including: email, Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, Reddit and Wechat. If you have access to the article, you will also have the option to share full text access with colleagues and peers via the link at the top – which will provide a special URL you can share with peers who wouldn't normally be able to access the full article content.



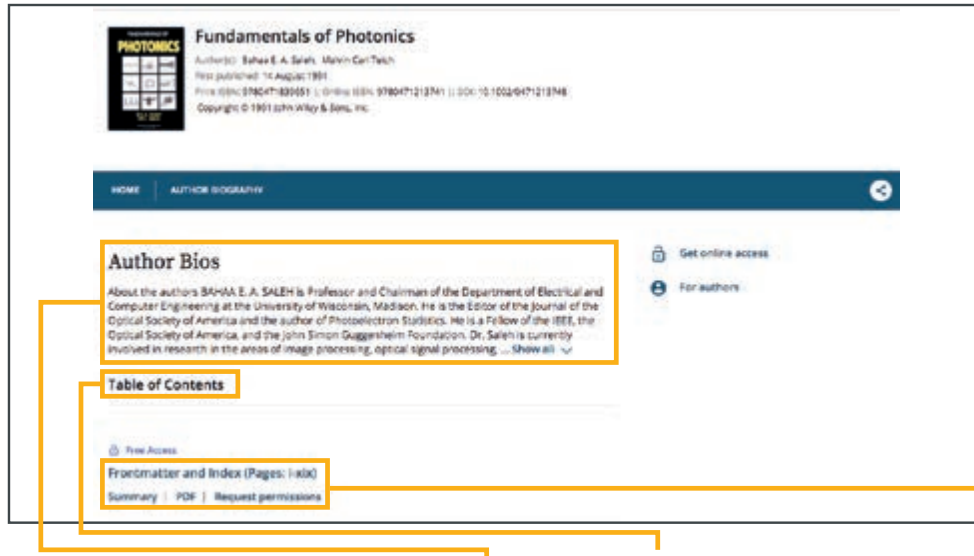
If an article has figures they can all be viewed cut here. You can view them directly on the webpage via a figure viewer or download them to a PowerPoint slide.

The related tab provides articles that are relevant to the subject and are recommended for further reading.

Current Protocols are now listed under journals and are displayed in exactly the same format, with the same functionalities.

## BOOK CONTENT FEATURES



Each book homepage displays the author's biography, a table of contents, the option to download each chapter as a PDF, and a list of references for each chapter. You will also be given the option to download the full book in PDF format.



The book pdf is not as interactive as the journal ePDF, but users can still zoom, print or download the content. ISBN information, publication history, keywords, and an option to choose 'full book PDF' or 'chapter PDF'.
